All supportive documentation other than photographs must be submitted in PDF or Word format only.

b) Building Projects

Before and after photos with each view described and identified by nominee’s name.

c) Letters of Support

All nominations require at least three letters of support. They should address the community impact of the nominee’s contribution and why the award is deserved.

d) How to Submit Materials

Excellence in Preservation Awards

Thousands of Kentuckians work tirelessly each year to preserve our legacy of architectural and cultural sites. The awards were established in 2012 to recognize exceptional leadership and accomplishments in the preservation of our heritage and distinguish best practices in the field. They are named in honor of preservation trailblazers with a long service of dedicated volunteer and professional time devoted to historic preservation.

Award Categories

Edith S. Bingham Excellence in Preservation Education

For preservation educators, projects or programs that have demonstrated excellence in traditional or nontraditional educational arenas. Includes nonprofit educational programming; archaeology, history or preservation educators in schools or colleges; preservation projects with an educational theme or outcome; and, historic or prehistoric sites with innovative preservation programs.

Christy and Owsley Brown II Excellence in Public Service to Preservation

For Kentucky's elected public officials, civil servants or public sector employees who have demonstrated outstanding leadership in public policy for preservation on the local, state and/or national level(s).

Linda Bruckheimer Excellence in Rural Preservation

For preservation leaders, projects or programs devoted to preserving Kentucky's important rural heritage with special consideration for towns with a population less than 10,000. Includes barn and farmland preservation; heritage-based education projects; and, historic architectural or archaeological surveys and National Register of Historic Places work intended to preserve rural properties.

Helen Dedman Excellence in Preservation Advocacy

For preservation advocates, volunteers or professionals who have shown great commitment of time and resources to furthering historic preservation across the state. Preference is given to those who have worked on local *and* state levels.

Barbara Hulette Excellence in Preservation Leadership

For those who have demonstrated exceptional leadership and made significant contributions in the field of historic preservation.

Patrick Kennedy Excellence in Preservation Craftsmanship

For preservation craftsmen/women who have demonstrated exceptional traditional building craft techniques and restoration skills on more than one preservation construction project across Kentucky. Preference is given to those who have demonstrated excellence in educating other craftsmen/women in our state.

Tim Peters and Lois Mateus Excellence in Making a Difference on Main Street

For individuals who have demonstrated outstanding dedication to historic preservation by restoring, rehabilitating and adaptively reusing a commercial or residential building(s) that has served as a catalyst for revitalizing a Main Street corridor. Special consideration will be given for individuals who have renovated a building(s) in communities with a population of 75,000 or less.

David L. Morgan Excellence in Kentucky's State Historic Rehabilitation Tax Credit, Commercial and Residential

Two categories: For commercial or residential projects with demonstrated excellence in preservation using Kentucky's State Historic Rehabilitation Tax Credit, which was enacted in 2005 to incentivize private investment in historic places.

Ann Early Sutherland Excellence in Environmental Preservation

For preservation leaders who have made a strong connection between the preservation of our built environment and the stewardship of our natural environment. Includes people, historic sites, educational programs and bricks-and-mortar projects.

Preservation Kentucky Excellence in Cultural Heritage Tourism

For an organization, site or attraction that has preserved and advanced Kentucky's architectural, cultural and social history through dynamic interpretation, and whose promotion of these historic resources has made a significant contribution to our tourism industry and the preservation of Kentucky's heritage.
